September 8, 2021

Regular Meeting

The Regular Meeting of the JVID Board of Directors was called to order at 6:00 P.M. by President Lambert.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Motion made by Director Brand to approve the September regular meeting agenda. Motion seconded by Director Jess and passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion made by Director Ohm to approve the August 11, 2021 minutes. Motion seconded by Director Jess and passed unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENT- ITEMS NOT ON AGENDA: None

JVID GENERAL:

Monthly Water Supply Report: The lake elevation as of 8/31/21 was 421.5. Total water in storage was 8,811 Ac-Ft (40% capacity). August irrigation water demand was 1917.2 Ac-Ft; treated water demand was 9.53 Ac-Ft. Rainfall July 2021 – June 2022 was 0.00”.

Set Board of Equalization Hearing: Motion made by Director Jess to set the BOE hearing for October 13th at 6:00 p.m. Motion seconded by Director Gonzalez and passed unanimously.

JVID IRRIGATION WATER SYSTEM:

Drought Update: The Kreth line is temporarily being fed by Lake Amador until irrigation demand decreases. Properties located on hill are starting to notice pressure problems, and hydrogen sulfide levels are increasing due to the low lake level.

CONCESSION REPORT: Mr. Lockhart reported that they have a couple busy weekends coming up. The restaurant is closed until the end of October. He is noticing some problems at the fish farm with warmer water in the afternoons and hydrogen sulfide levels; he has started running off his creek pump to mitigate the problem.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS REPORTS, COMMITTEE REPORTS and DIRECTOR

COMMENTS: Director Jess reported on the Amador County Groundwater Management Authority meeting. Directors Gonzalez and Ohm met with AWA to discuss becoming a permanent customer.

GENERAL MANAGER’S REPORT: The GM reported that the annual DSOD inspection is next month. He has requested bids for a diver to inspect the inlet. The Ione Band of Miwok Indians received an engineering grant to determine how they will connect to treated water system.

APPROVAL OF BILLS: Motion made by Director Jess to approve the bills as presented. Motion seconded by Director Gonzalez and passed unanimously.
